





More from Family Faith Formation...

For many Christian Parents and caregivers, the idea of helping children grow in faith is intimidating. We ask ourselves questions like these: "What if I mess up and teach them something wrong?" "How can I do this when my own faith is wavering?" or "I didn't grow up as a Christian. What if I don't know enough?" Before you do anything else, exhale. Family faith formation is a journey, not a destination, and growing in faith is an adventure, not a checklist. Along that journey there will be moments or discovery and joy, hard times, and times of confusion. But your guide on this adventure is none other than the Holy Spirit—so embrace the journey!

Ways to help your family grow in faith...

- Be a signpost: your job as a Christian parent is to point your family toward God. Look for opportunities to do that in your daily life together. Whenever you see something true, noble, right, pure, lovely, admirable, excellent, or praiseworthy (Phil 4:8), take special notice. Thank God together for that person, place or thing.
- Explore God's Story: if it's hard to gather the whole family for after-dinner devotions, find other ways and times to explore God's story together. For example, pick up a pack of the excellent God's Big Story Cards (FaithAliveResources.org) and use them as discussion starters. Consider choosing, memorizing and displaying a family "theme verse." Or post a short passage on your refrigerator on Sunday morning, and then talk about it at the end of the week after you've had time to "live into it" together.
