

# HIGHLIGHTS of Classis Kalamazoo (January 26):

- 1. Classis heard and affirmed the examination of ministerial candidate Karis Mpindi. Karis will serve as a minister on loan to St. John Reformed Church of Montreal, QC from his calling church, Grace CRC.
- 2. Classis received a "state of the church" report from Comstock CRC and Grace CRC. Each congregation shared the blessings and growth opportunities they experience as they live out Christ's mission for His church.
- 3. Classis reviewed and adopted a recommendation to reduce the number of meetings annually from 3 to 2 (March & September) beginning in 2017.
