

- 1. The Shepherding Elders shared a verbal report of their ministry activities including the pastoral care of our home bound members.
- 2. The Shepherding Deacons shared a verbal update of their work including the distribution of year-end giving statements and the ministry of the benevolent fund to our community.
- 3. The minutes of the Administrative Board were approved. This included a notice that the nomination process for new office-bearers will begin in February. The council was also asked to complete the annual Pastor Evaluation form.
- 4. The December financial report was reviewed. Appreciation was expressed for the generosity of the congregation for the General Fund as well as support of other ministries.
- 5. Council received Pastor Simon's written report of his activities.
- 6. Classis delegates for the March 12, 2024 meeting of Classis Kalamazoo are Pastor Simon, Elder Glen Wagner and Deacon Jonathan Mejeur.
- 7. The council adopted the following motion: Heritage Christian Reformed Church of Kalamazoo, MI requests that Classis Kalamazoo, with the concurring advice of the synodical deputies, approve the position of Missionary President to the Leadership Education Mission for Africa as being consistent with the calling of a minister of the Word (Church Order, Article 12-c). A letter will be sent to the congregation with more details.

Adopt Daisy and her sister Maisy! Over the past 17 years, Heritage CRC has partnered with Growing Hope Globally (https:// www.growinghopeglobally.org/) and two other churches in Kalamazoo (Grace and Third CRC) to tackle world hunger through the Dairy Project!

The way the Dairy Project works is Red Arrow Dairy donates 5 cows that churches "adopt" to cover their feed and veterinary care expenses. In return, the dairy donates the value of the milk produced to Growing Hope Globally. In 2023, church contributions, the value of the milk produced and donations of suppliers to the dairy raised \$30,317. This money will go to support World Renew projects in Bangladesh and Cambodia. As we look to a new year of support for Growing Hope Globally, you can now sign up on the "Adopt-a-Cow" poster. This will provide an op-

portunity for members to adopt Daisy and her sister Maisy for \$55/week or \$235/month in 2024. Every dollar donated is typically matched 4-1 through the Dairy Project.
