

Council News...

The Church Council met on March 22 at 7 PM. The Council opened with the reading of Scripture and with prayer.

The first order of business was the review of correspondence which was primarily summary information for the upcoming Synod meeting. Reports from the Denominational Ministries were received into record.

The Shepherding Elders reported on the pastoral needs of the church over the last month. The Deacons reported on available benevolence funds and noted that church giving to benevolence had been very good.

The Council Clerk had recently conducted evaluation interviews with the Pastor and church staff, and reported these evaluations to the Council. The evaluations were all very positive.

The Admin Board reviewed the financial statements from January and February, and reported to the Church Council that a person had been identified who would conduct an audit of the church books for the past year. The Admin Board also reported on its deliberations of the need for a "who does what" document concerning the church properties and facilities. Once compiled, this document will be shared with the church. The Admin Board also noted that church organ repairs were proceeding on schedule and that the church facility was in generally good condition.

The Council reviewed the nominations that had been received for church office and set the schedule for the final selection of officers.

The Pastor reported on his activities over the past month noting that there had been much need for pastoral care.

The meeting came to an end with members noting that the terms of office for several members were now coming to an end. People expressed appreciation for having been given the opportunity to serve and were thanked for their service.

The Council closed with prayer at 8:31 PM.
