

Campus Ministry Update:

We have had a wonderful year in campus ministry. The number of students who attend the lunch is only slightly bigger (150-175 weekly) but the relational growth among students has grown much deeper and more authentic. Last week as we evaluated the semester and year, we could name over 25 students with whom we have developed a quality relationship this year. Conversations with students have grown and students have increasingly shared their real feelings and thoughts. This openness allows us to understand real thoughts and needs providing the avenue to more authentic faith discussions. So many students expressed the desire to remain in contact during the summer that we have decided to provide a different place, format and different day of the week to meet for lunch. We will experiment with a number of things and provide some study options. This year we have been able to develop friendships with many of the Fulbright scholars at WMU. Over half of them come regularly to the International lunch, including almost all of the officers in their Registered Student Organization. As staff, we have been sitting in and participating in some studies that others lead to present basic Christianity. In each study there are International students and visiting scholars. We are looking for some of these students to profess faith in Jesus Christ.

This is a very snapshot of the International ministry this year. Our evaluation is that it was outstanding year of ministry. God is at work.
