

Rebuilding: The Book of Nehemiah ~ Nehemiah is called by God to rebuild the wall around Jerusalem so that the remnant in Israel may dwell again in the city. It's ultimately the story of an unfaithful people's encounter with the unrelenting faithfulness of God who longs to see His people restored. Council Update on Preschool Expan-

sion: Near the end of September, the council sent a letter to the congregation with an update on the KCSA Preschool Expansion plan. Soon after, a draft of the design plan for the building expansion was put up on display boards in the church, and we are grateful for the feedback we received.

When initial acceptance of this project was adopted in April it included requiring the congregation to approve the building design prior to the school moving ahead with the project. To that end a congregational meeting is scheduled for Sunday, November 10. Along with sharing an update on the project the congregation will be asked to approve the building design so that KCSA may move ahead and build an addition on to our facility for the Early Education Program.
