Security...

As an annual reminder, here is a summary of a letter on what steps to take should an emergency arises.

- The first step is to be aware of your surroundings. Know the location of the closest exit to the building. Be alert to unusual occurrences as members and guests arrive for services or ministry events. If you should notice something out of the ordinary, please direct your concern to an usher, greeter or a member of the Council.
- The second step we implemented is that soon after services begin every external door is locked. Signs posted on the doors indicate that the main entry is available once the doors are locked and only when opened by those who will keep watch for late-comers.
- In the unlikely event a crisis situation should occur, the Department of Homeland Security urges a "Run, Hide, Fight" response.

Run

The First priority is to remove yourself and others from the situation and to exit the building. Once outside, it is imperative that everyone move as quickly as possible to safety.

Hide

There are several "safe rooms" available in the church. Three of the restrooms (men's and women's restroom in the Education Wing and the men's restroom in the Fellowship Hall) have boards fastened to the inside of the entry door which can be used to barricade the room in the event our members and visitors need to seek shelter. Additional safe rooms are the furnace/boiler room, the room where the Council meets, and the entire nursery, making certain the doors are locked after entering. Window blockers will be available to prevent anyone from seeing people in that room.

Fight

As a last resort, and only if your life is in imminent danger, your priority should be to stop the threat. This may require you to grab whatever is available and throwing them at the attacker. A fire extinguisher could also be used as a weapon of defense.
