

Council Report (9/24/19 Meeting)

- The Shepherding Elders shared a verbal report on their work including an initiative to provide greater insight to the small group ministry.
- The Shepherding Deacons shared a verbal report on their work highlighting their ministry to the community through the benevolent fund.
- The work of the Administrative Board was reviewed. This included the approval of a request from International Family Ministry to rent the church facility for a Family Conference October 25-27 and a request to the Classis Kalamazoo Safe Church coordinator to assist us in updating our Safe Church Policy. It was also noted that a commercial assessment on the property potentially for sale along 11th street will be completed soon, and a final recommendation will be brought to the congregation.
