



Council Report for 9/27/2017

- Pastor Simon opened with devotions based on Hebrews 11.
- The council discussed Chapter 1 of "Growing Young: 6 Essential Strategies to Help Young People Discover and Love Your Church."
- The Shepherding Deacons shared a verbal update on their work. Gratitude was shared for the recent offering for World Renew (\$3,500). In view of the continued natural disasters in Mexico, Puerto Rico and Caribbean, a second offering is scheduled for Sunday, October 8.
- The Shepherding Elders shared a verbal report on their work. It was noted that the new season of Sunday School will begin Sunday, October 8. Kim Bruinwood and Teri Wagner will teach the youngest class, Pastor Simon the high schoolers, and the middle school class to be taught by several members: Glen Wagner (October), Judy Wieringa (November), Emma Schering (December), Ferrel Stremler (January), Ellen Byle (February), and March (TBA).


