

### What's up in Worship

This week's sermon is part of the sermon series: The Church's One Foundation (1 Corinthians). The sermon title is: "When We Come Together to Eat", 1 Corinthians 11:17-34.



**Celebrating Communion:** On Sunday, February 5, we will celebrate the Lord's Supper. We invite all who have been baptized in the name of the Triune God and confess Jesus as their Savior, to join us at the table of our Lord for Communion. In preparation for coming to the Table, we invite you to "examine" (1 Corinthians 11:28) your hearts by reflecting on these words from the Heidelberg Catechism.

Q. Who are to come to the Lord's table?

A. Those who are displeased with themselves because of their sins, but who nevertheless trust that their sins are pardoned and that their continuing weakness is covered by the suffering and death of Christ, and who also desire more and more to strengthen their faith and to lead a better life. Hypocrites and those who are unrepentant, however, eat and drink judgment on themselves. (Lord's Day 30, Q&A 81)

Arrow Dairy donates 5 cows and churches "rent" or "adopt" a cow to cover their feed and veterinary care expenses. In return, the dairy donates the value of the milk produced back to the churches.



Over the past 16 years, \$445,000 has been raised to support World Renew projects (<u>https://worldrenew.net/</u>) through Growing Hope Globally. In 2022, church contributions, the value of the milk produced and the donations of suppliers to the dairy raised \$\$31,116.82. This money will go to support World Renew projects in various countries.
